# The Directors <br> The MNHS Band is directed by Mr. Ryan Placek and Mr. Craig Mathis 

Mr. Ryan Placek is entering his 23rd year in education and his third year on staff as the new Instrumental Music Director at Millard North High School. He has previously held positions with Bellevue East High School, Bellevue University, Plattsmouth Community Schools, and with Johnson -Brock Public Schools.


Mr. Placek earned his Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 1991. He completed his Masters degree in Educational Administration with an emphasis in Music Curriculum and Supervision from the University of Nebraska at Kearney. In 2004, he was awarded the Nebraska Music Educators Association "Music Educator of the Year" Award for the state of Nebraska. He was recently elected to a three year term as Band Affairs Chair for the Nebraska Music Educators Association. He has been a member of Who's Who of America's Teachers in 1995, 2005, and 2006.

Mr. Placek continues to clinic groups throughout the state and has adjudicated several area music contests and festivals including District Music Contest. Mr. Placek is an active member of the National Association for Music Education, Nebraska Music Educators Association, Nebraska State Bandmasters Association, and the National Education Association. In his spare time, he enjoys working out, traveling, following drum corps, performing with area ensembles, attending sporting events, and spending time with family and friends

Mr. Craig Mathis is in his third year as the Assistant Band Director at Millard North High School. In addition to his responsibilities at Millard North, Craig is the Band Director at Montclair Elementary and Cody Elementary. Mr. Mathis is a graduate of Millard North High School and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. While at UNL, Mr. Mathis was the drum major of the Cornhusker Marching Band, principal chair in the UNL Wind Ensemble \&Orchestra, and played lead trombone on the UNL Jazz Ensemble CD "Beyond the Plains."

Before coming to Millard North, Mr. Mathis taught at Beatrice High School as the High School Band Director. While at Beatrice High School, Mr. Mathis directed a successful band program that received superior ratings in both Marching and Concert Bands. Band enrollment increased nearly $10 \%$ during his tenure and All-State participation tripled. He successfully led a push for new band uniforms, his marching band performed at the Disney Magic Music Days in Disneyland, and he helped to design a brand new trailer for the marching band.

Mr. Mathis is a member of the National Association for Music Education, Nebraska Music Educator's Association, Nebraska State Education Association, National Education Association, and is the Public Relations Chair of the Nebraska State
 Bandmasters Association. In his spare time, Craig enjoys spending time with his family \& his wife, and is an avid college football fan.

## !!!The Bands Are All Here at Millard North!!!



Concert Bands All students participate in one of three concert ensembles. Concert band begins after marching season has concluded at the end of first quarter. The concert groups at North are the foundation of all other instrumental performing groups. These ensembles are where students learn to grow through study of the fundamentals of good musicianship. The three ensembles at North include:
Concert Band (freshmen) - This ensemble provides freshmen with a balanced comprehensive study of music through performance, which develops skills in the psychomotor, cognitive, and emotional domains. Instruction is designed to enable students to connect, examine, imagine, define, try, extend, refine and integrate music study into other subject areas.
Symphonic Band (students in $10^{\text {th }}-12^{\text {th }}$ grades) - Students perform, with expression and technical accuracy, a large and varied repertoire of concert band literature that is developmentally appropriate. Evaluation of music and music performances is included.
Wind Ensemble (students in $10^{\text {th }}-12^{\text {th }}$ grades) This highly selective ensemble performs band repertoire of the highest caliber. Mastery of advanced wind band technique must be evident. Areas of refinement consist of advanced techniques including, but not limited to: (1) intonation, (2) balance and blend, (3) breathing, (4) tone production, (5) tone quality, (6) technique, (7) rhythm, (8) sight-reading, and (9) critical listening skills. Evaluation of music and music performances is included.

Marching Band All students participate in marching band in the fall. Freshmen participate in parades, se-

造lect pre-game performances and pep band at home football games. Freshmen learn funda-
 mentals of marching as well as performing their own half time show.

Color Guard The Millard North High School Color Guard is a program of excellence. Being involved in this rewarding activity provides students with the benefits of work ethic, time management, self-esteem, performance, friendship, and fun. Our high school guard program has grown in recent years and we look forward to continue this trend as our band continues to experience growth. The color guard has become established as a competitive, vital aspect of the marching program, and our members are committed to excellence. We would like to continue to grow our program by building community awareness and participation. Auditions for this highly visible group are usually held in the late spring. No experience is necessary!

Winter Guard The Millard North Winter Guard program is an opportunity for students to learn or continue to build on skills during the winter and spring season. This group participates and competes in the Heartland Winter Arts Association circuit in Eastern Nebraska against other competing schools. Areas of learning include body movement, dance, and equipment which are all put together into a competitive show. Auditions are held after the marching season but NO previous experience necessary.

Pep Band All students are required to participate in Pep Band as part of their performance grade. Students attend a specific number of performances and receive points toward lettering for attending extra performances beyond the minimum requirements. This is a fun activity that allows the students to perform, watch the game, and socialize with friends all at the same time!

Jazz Band Millard North High School offers two jazz ensembles including Jazz I, a competitive group that meets before school two or three mornings a week. This group boasts many accomplishments including currently having three members selected to the All-State Jazz Band as well as members of the metro area's Metropolitan Area Youth Jazz Orchestra. Jazz II (Stage Band) is a secondary group that works on the fundamentals of jazz and explores many styles through a less competitive atmosphere. Both ensembles participate in local jazz festivals.


Orchestra Many band instruments are needed for Orchestra and students may audition if interested. Auditions will be held in the fall with the Orchestra director. Band students will typically attend Orchestra rehearsals once a week during first or second hours.

Solo/Chamber Ensemble Students are highly encouraged to enhance their performance experience through optional solo and ensemble groups. Various opportunities are announced during class and interested students may sign up to perform. Some opportunities include the Elkhorn Band Olympics ( $9^{\text {th }}$ and $10^{\text {th }}$ grades only), various honor bands including All-State ensembles (mostly $10^{\text {th }}$ through $12^{\text {th }}$ grades), and District Music Contest.

The College Entrance Examination Board found that students involved in public school music programs scored 107 points higher on the SAT's than students with no participation.

Studying Music Strengthens Students' Academic Performance. Rhode Island studies have indicated that sequential, skill-building instruction in art and music integrated with the rest of the curriculum can greatly improve children's performance in reading and math. ("Learning Improved by Arts Training" by Martin Gardiner, Alan Fox, Faith Knowles, and Donna Jeffrey, Nature magazine)

Music involvement teaches young people many skills necessary to succeed in life including: teamwork, responsibility, organizational skills, persistence, multi-tasking skills, memorization skills, leadership, performance, physical fitness, mental toughness, problem solving, selfconfidence, imagination, character, informed perception, self-discipline, and pushing one's self to a higher level of achievement (Various research documents and reports)

In music, a mistake is a mistake; the instrument is in tune or not, the notes are well played or not, the entrance is made or not. It is only by much hard work that a successful performance is possible. Through music study, students learn the value of sustained effort to achieve excellence and the concrete rewards of hard work.

Admissions officers at 70 percent of the nation's major universities have stated that high school credit and achievement in the arts are significant considerations for admission to their institutions.

Students with band and orchestra experience attend college at a rate twice the national average.
